Community Consultation Meeting & Study Launch

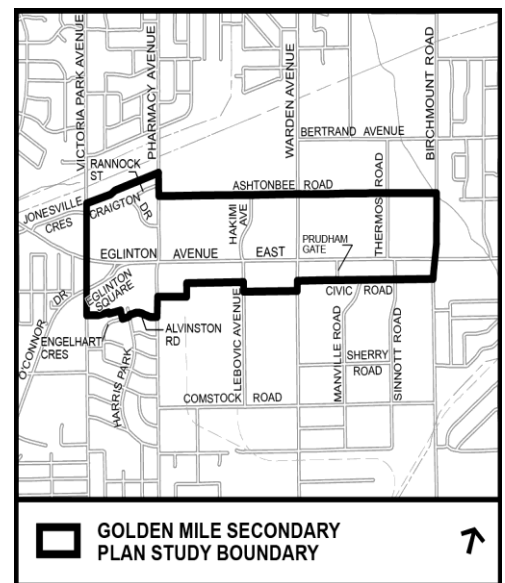
Join us on June 28th for the launch of a Golden Mile Planning Study and help plan for the future of the Golden Mile!

The Eglinton Crosstown Light Rail Transit (LRT) is being constructed along Eglinton Avenue, from Weston Road to Kennedy Road. When the LRT opens in 2021, it will pass through the Golden Mile area. There will be five surface LRT stops between Victoria Park Avenue and Birchmount Road.

The Eglinton Crosstown LRT will bring change to the Golden Mile. The City of Toronto Planning Division is undertaking a **"Golden Mile Secondary Plan Study"** in advance of construction of the Eglinton Crosstown LRT. The intent of this Study is to develop a vision and planning framework to guide future development of the Golden Mile area. The Study area includes lands north and south of Eglinton Avenue East, between Victoria Park Avenue and Birchmount Road. The Study is expected to be completed in late 2018.

Join us on June 28th at our first public consultation meeting to learn more about the Study and how you can participate. Together with City Planning, you will play a key role in shaping the Golden Mile as a new community. You will help determine:

- what kind and sizes of buildings would be in the Golden Mile;
- where people will live and work;
- where new streets will be located;
- how these new streets will function;
- where parks and public spaces will be located;
- what community services are needed and where; and
- what community features are needed for the Golden Mile.

Transportation Master Plan & Master Servicing Plan—Notice of Commencement

To ensure we plan ahead for transportation and water infrastructure, the Golden Mile Secondary Plan Study will include a Transportation Master Plan (TMP) and Master Servicing Plan (MSP). Both the TMP and MSP will satisfy Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) process. This Class EA process involves the identification of the problem/opportunity, developing and evaluating a reasonable range of alternative solutions, selecting a preferred solution and providing opportunities for public input.
