

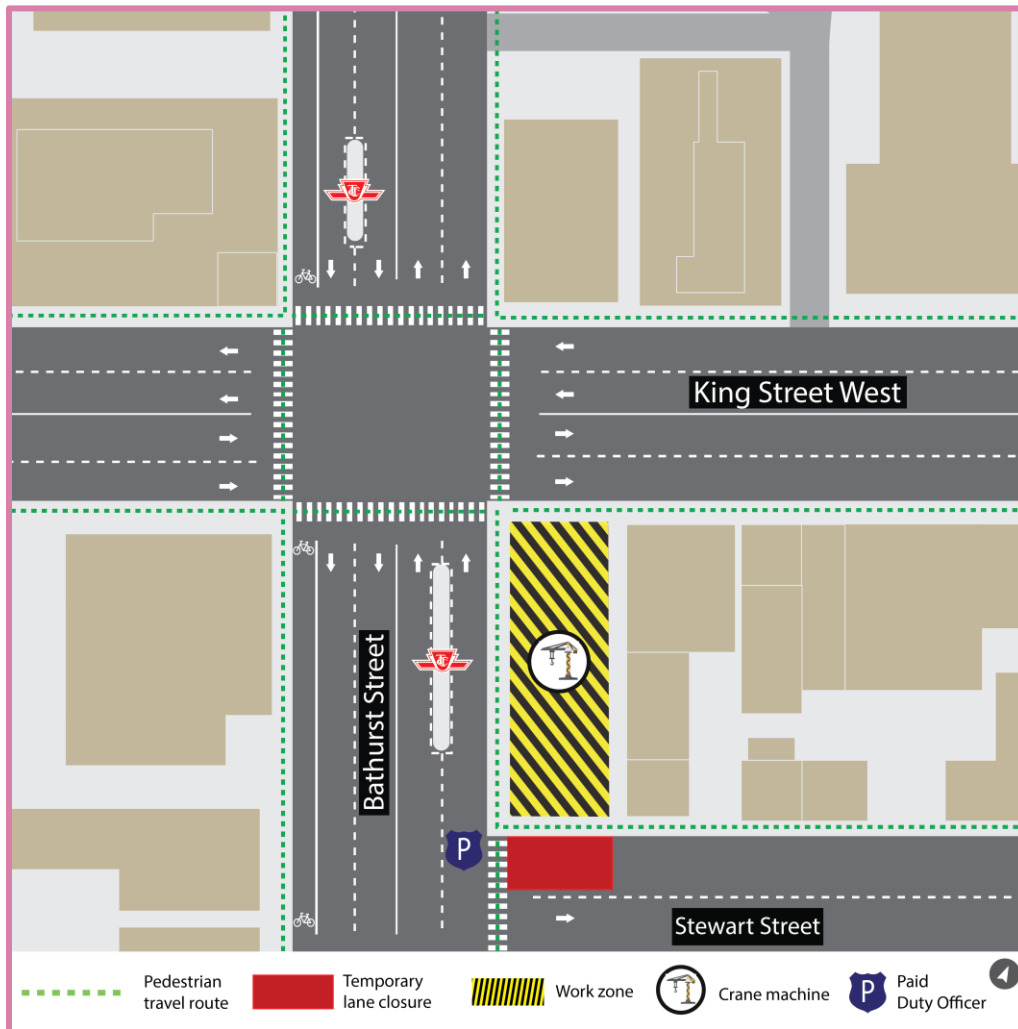
Tower Crane installation at King-Bathurst Station

Expected start date: As early as September 5, 2024

Expected duration: Through Saturday, September 7, 2024

Hours of work: Daily from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

What is happening?

As part of ongoing construction of the Ontario Line and the future King-Bathurst station, crews will be installing a tower crane at the south site of King-Bathurst, which will help support excavation.

To install the overhead crane, a flat bed truck will deliver the tower and mast components to King-Bathurst, starting on September 5, 2024.

The crane will be assembled on-site, however the delivery requires traffic control persons and a paid duty officer to guide a flatbed truck to the site, and partially close the north lane of Stewart Street, while maintaining safe operations

and passage for vehicles and pedestrians on Bathurst Street northbound.

The flatbed truck will unload materials for the crane assembly, starting in the morning of Thursday, September 5. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.

What to expect

- A tower crane will be delivered to the south station site, at King-Bathurst. The crane delivery will require a short-term closure of the northernmost lane on Stewart Street, while the equipment is being delivered to the worksite. Assembly of the crane will be done entirely within the station site. This operation will be supported by paid duty officers who will guide pedestrians and cyclists safely.
- Assembly and installation of tower crane components, including the operator cab and mast.
- Some welding will take place on-site as part of the tower crane assembly.
- Testing and final commissioning of the tower crane.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
